#### **SCHOOL BANKING**—Thursdays



On Friday students from Prep-Year 6 will bring home an *Interim Report* to share with parents/carers. The short-term report includes a number of statements that help to provide an initial indication of how your child has settled into the school year. Teachers are also preparing the individual student *Learning Portfolios*. The portfolios provide additional and specific information about each child's developing skills and knowledge along with areas for future focus. Term I workpieces will include a Writing and Maths task, both with teacher comments, as well as a reading sample.

Parent/Teacher Conversations are scheduled in the week beginning Monday 14<sup>th</sup> May. These discussions offer an opportunity to view the portfolios for information, queries, achievements and challenges to be shared as part of supporting each student's learning and wellbeing. Further information regarding how to book times to meet with teachers in that week will be given before the end of this term. Parents / carers are also able to discuss student progress throughout the year. Sometimes an informal chat at drop off or pick up time is enough, at other times it may be better to arrange a suitable time to meet.

Parents and carers of Kindergarten children are encouraged to have ongoing conversations with kinder staff to support the transition to school for our youngest students. Throughout the year samples and information from each Kinder student are also collected for an individual *Portfolio*, based on the five outcomes from the *Early Learning Years Framework*. Kinder parents will have the opportunity for parent/teacher conversations in May and will receive a mid -year statement as well as an end of year comment with the *Portfolio* in December.

On the Calendar—Friday 16<sup>th</sup> March is National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence (NDA). This day helps to raise awareness of what bullying is and also to promote strategies that have been shown to prevent and reduce bullying. These include the importance of positive values such as respect, inclusion and cooperation along with the promotion of supportive relationships and student wellbeing. Developing skills and actions for all students to respond appropriately to bullying behaviour, and to support students being bullied, is encouraged. Senior students will share some ideas with us at assembly on Friday.

Next week is Harmony Week, promoting the message of 'everyone belongs'. Just last week a parent marvelled at the number of different backgrounds and cultures represented in our school population. Activities within schools and the wider community help to foster understanding of diversity, to nurture respect and foster a sense of belonging for all. Students and staff at GSPS will undertake a range of activities over the week including exploring cultures and traditions within our community.


