### **Australian Maths Competition**

Students in Years 3-6 have the opportunity to participate in the Australian Maths Competition again this year. Students are asked to solve thirty problems in 60 minutes. The problems get progressively more difficult with students of all standards finding a point of challenge.

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The competition date is *Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> August* when participating students will attempt the same tasks, on the same day in about 40 countries. Goulburn Street students will sit the paper in a room together.

The aims of the Competition are three-fold:

- 1. To highlight the importance of mathematics as a curriculum subject
- 2. To give students an opportunity to discover talent in mathematics
- 3. To provide resources for the classroom and general discussion

The cost is \$6.50 per student to register.
