Last week students in Year 3 & 5 took part in the annual National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy. Teachers supervising NAPLAN sessions noticed, and were impressed with, the focus and effort GSPS students gave to each assessment. Family members played an important role and we thank you for reassuring and encouraging students to do their best on the day. Data from NAPLAN helps staff to identify learning trends and areas to focus our teaching with past results leading to our current school

We also recognise the value of assessing as students learn. Everyday tasks, questioning techniques, conversations and observations can also be used to gather evidence of learning. Such information is used by staff to shape future teaching and learning opportunities. A clear learning goal and steps/criteria to achieve success are important strategies in helping students build skills and understandings. We often talk about 'bumping up' our work and use success criteria or a quality example to demonstrate what is possible. This also reinforces the notion that our early efforts are not always indicative of our potential and that we get better with reflection, feedback and practice.

Student Contributions to our School Community—There are many occasions when Goulburn Street students assist others and contribute to our positive school culture. Examples include acts of kindness such as stopping to help someone who has fallen over, picking up sports equipment or someone's jumper that has been left outside. Students across our school use friendly greetings, include others in games and cooperate to share and build on ideas as they learn and play together. They comment that when you help others or do a service for the school it also helps you to feel good – a boomerang effect! There are also more structured examples of students supporting our school, such as the roster of our Year 5 group who assist in the canteen during lunchtimes with over the counter sales, providing a service to the school and gaining skills along the way. Year 6 students are significant contributors through the Daily PE program. Working in teams the leaders share responsibility for planning and organising active games for Prep-Year 5 students; setting up equipment, instructing and encouraging younger students as they participate. The daily sessions form an important part of the required physical activity time for all students and help to develop leadership skills and teamwork for the Year 6s.

Communication—A number of community members and parents have noticed and appreciate the changes to our school website. The updated site includes relevant forms and documents, a calendar and a section with 'latest news', which we do endeavour to keep updated! This week we have also introduced an SMS Broadcast service, to provide text messages to families as another form of communication for special events/times.

Yesterday families should have received a text about the *Magic 123 parent sessions* as an initial message to test the system and to remind all parents that this course is available to our community. The SMS service will be useful for times such as alerting parents/carers to postponements of carnivals/excursions due to weather or as reminders of events. If you did not receive the SMS yesterday please contact the office so that we can check our records are accurate.

Australian Maths Competition

Students in Years 3-6 have the opportunity to participate in the Australian Maths Competition again this year. Students are asked to solve thirty problems in 60 minutes. The problems get progressively more difficult with students of all standards finding a point of challenge.

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The competition date is *Thursday 9th August* when participating students will attempt the same tasks, on the same day in about 40 countries. Goulburn Street students will sit the paper in a room together.

The aims of the Competition are three-fold:

- 1. To highlight the importance of mathematics as a curriculum subject
- 2. To give students an opportunity to discover talent in mathematics
- 3. To provide resources for the classroom and general discussion

The cost is \$6.50 per student to register.
